Tony Oglesby is the Payment Processing Services executive for Consumer & Small Business Bank Technology & Operations. He is responsible for leading improvements in customer and associate delight, operational efficiencies through end-to-end process enhancements and integration. Payment Processing Services (PPS) consists of approximately 7,500 associates located in 22 Check Capture sites, 19 Lockbox locations, 27 Proof Encoding sites, 4 Retail Payment sites, and 2 Universal Landing Zone (ULZ) sites. The ULZ insures data perfection and balancing of imaged transactions from ATM's and other payment channels.

Tony joined Bank of America in 1993. He has held several key roles within Check Processing, Lockbox, and Cash Vault. His roles include Consumer Real Estate Servicing manager, Consumer/Commercial Operations & Platform Technology manager, Transaction Services Texas & the Midwest Region Executive, and Nationwide Check Processing & Proof Executive. Prior to taking the helm for PPS, Tony led the Check Functional team and Southeast Region of PPS. He has been in his current position since 2006.

Tony was recently named one of this year's Best of Six Sigma for 2007 award recipients at Bank of America. The prestigious award recognizes teams that use Six Sigma methodologies and tools to drive the bank's business results. He is also Greenbelt Certified and a Certified Champion.
